CHANGING LIVES

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Course Content:

- To explore the current debates of sex work and sexual exploitation on a national level.
- Participants will gain knowledge and understanding about the nature of sex work in the local area, the primary needs of the client group and how to support these. The client groups cover young people, men and women.
- To share good practice around trauma informed environments and challenges when engaging with clients who have multiple and complex needs.
- Explore common stereotypes about people involved in sex work.
- To recognise the needs of clients at the age of transition (16-25) and those who are targeted for the purposes of sexual exploitation.
- To gain knowledge about the law and sex work and the role of the police Dedicated Liaison Officer's (DLO's).
- To identify common features of the lives of individuals involved in sex work and those vulnerable to sexual exploitation with particular regard to physical and mental health.

By the end of this course participants should be familiar with good practice guidelines working with people involved in sex work and those vulnerable to sexual exploitation.
